Redwood National Park is hiring for seasonal Fire Effects Monitoring staff for 2024. These staff work under the Wildland Fire Program with the Fire Ecologist. Based out of Redwood National Park, the fire effects monitoring staff serves the Klamath network of National parks, including Redwood National Park, Crater Lake National Park, Lassen Volcanic National Park, Lava Beds National Monument, Whiskeytown National Recreation Area, and Oregon Caves National Monument and Preserve. Within this 5–6-month position, there is frequent travel to perform data collection at the network parks.

A fire effects monitor performs vegetation and fuels monitoring as a part of a crew at a variety of established data collection plots in areas that experience prescribed and wild fires. Data management, botany, and computer-based work, are additional aspects of the position. To a lesser degree, wildland fire and prescribed fire operations within the network parks are supported by the Fire Ecology program and Fire Effects Monitoring staff.

Temporary housing may be available with this position.

Salary ranges from \$16.57 to \$20.14 per hour. Medical, dental and vision benefits available.

Major duties of position that are expected to be performed on the job:

- Electronic data collection, data entry and database management
- Computer and tablet use
- Hiking, camping, field work
- Botany and plant ID
- Teamwork and being a member of a field crew
- Travel
- Safety and first aid
- Utilizing field monitoring gear
- Wildfire and prescribed fire operations
  - Working as a FEMO (fire effects monitor), Resource Advisor, or qualified wildland fire fighter
