**Forestry Technician/Timber Cruiser
Part Time/Full Time Weekdays/Weekends
Pay Range: \$16.00 - \$20.00**

EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

One season's experience working as a timber cruiser under a licensed forester.

DUTIES:

- a. A timber cruiser must be able to orient using map and compass.
- b. Must be able to use a diameter tape, relaskop and laser range finder.
- c. He/She must also be able to follow directions, implement directions accurately and provide accurate timber measurements.

Project specifications are as follows:

- d. Forestry technicians shall work under a licensed forester and perform timber marking, timber cruising and THP layout one to three days a week during the school year with possible full-time summer employment.
- e. Install inventory plots per specifications following company cruise specifications.
- f. Provide daily route maps and excel doc or cruise cards by the end of each pay period and update the master map.
- g. Download/enter cruise data collected in the field into the company data entry program per their specifications prior to the end of the pay period. Multiple entries are acceptable prior to the period. Provide to Stephen Hohman for review and submittal to company.
- h. Complete daily time sheet documenting travel time/hours worked/lunch taken and the # of plots completed. If the plots are reworked, please state so.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

A timber cruiser needs to have the ability to hike through steep, non-trailed terrain in all types of weather wearing long pants, long sleeved shirts, and carrying an average 40 lb pack for a duration of 8-10 hours per day.

They must be physically fit enough to be able to perform task while hiking without being so short of breath as to distract from concentrating on the task to be done.

They must be able to work under the conditions described at a reasonable pace while maintaining normal, safe blood pressure and heart rate.

A timber cruiser must have the physical flexibility to move the following ways without risk of injury to him or herself: must easily rotate head fully to be able to line up chin with each shoulder, be able to easily rotate ankles, be able to bring knees up to thigh level, to have the ability to reach arms above their head and have the ability to lift head to look straight up.

A timber cruiser must not have such severe allergic reactions to any aspect of the forest environment so as to make working in the forest a danger to the employee or impair their ability to do the job. Allergies may include bee stings and poison oak.
